CLUB KIDS GIVING BACK

TECH SAVVY CLUBS

Last year we set out to transform our Club Tech programs and raise funds to increase our members' access to technology. With the support from Best Buy, Chico Sunrise Rotary, Gala Bids for Technology and Brian & Karen Sweeney we now have tablets throughout all our Club sites. Club youth have been able to conquer homework assignments, learn coding, create videos and access an unlimited amount of educational resources.



Our goal is to have a SMART room with a Mondopad in each of our main Clubs in Chico, Paradise and Oroville. Our Oroville Teen Center has the first Mondopad and they are exploring ways to make educational programs more engaging and fun. These upgrades are helping our youth learn how to use technology ethically and responsibly and be prepared for their future.







LEADERS IN THE WILD

Our Teens had a summer like no other and one they will remember for the rest of their lives. Our Chico, Oroville and Paradise Teen Centers had the opportunity to explore the numerous lakes, meadows and mountain wilderness of Lassen Volcanic National Park. Thanks to a grant from the Lassen Park Foundation and summer donations, teens went beyond the ordinary camping experiences and developed an appreciation for the environment by hiking throughout the park, learning about different ecosystems, building teamwork skills, strengthening friendships and telling stories around the campfire. They got to explore Lassen Volcanic National Park's numerous volcanoes, including Lassen Peak, which is one of the largest plug dome volcanoes in the world.

In between hiking excursions, the teens had the opportunity to learn outdoor survival skills from park rangers who showed them how to build a proper campfire, held shelter building contests for emergency survival and talked about how to be environmentally responsible and keep the park clean.
